Dr. Ahmet Alibašić is a full professor of Islamic civilization at the Faculty of Islamic Studies, University of Sarajevo. He graduated in Islamic Studies and Political Sciences in 1997 and 1998, respectively. He obtained his master's degree in 1999 at ISTAC (Malaysia) and PhD in 2011 at the Faculty of Political Sciences, University of Sarajevo. His areas of academic and research interests include Islam in Europe, contemporary Islamic socio-political thought, Relations between state and religious communities, human rights in Islam and the Muslim world, and interreligious dialogue. He is the author of several books, including *Arab Spring, Muslim Scholars (Ulema), and Muslim Intellectuals* (2022) and *Principles of Good Governance in Islamic Civilization* (2022). He is one of the editors of *Yearbook of Muslims in Europe* (Brill, 2009-2023) and serves as one of the executive directors of the HORIZON 2020 project "RESILIENCE".
